

WHAT IS THE NEW MOBILIZATION?

It is a broad coalition of peace, religious, labor and student organizations. Some of the cooperating national organizations are the Americans for Democratic Action, American Friends Service Committee, Peace Fellowships of the Catholic, Episcopal and Jewish faiths, Clergy and Laymen Concerned About Vietnam, Fellowship of Reconciliation, National Black Students Association, National Council of Churches, National Welfare Rights Organization, New Democratic Coalition, SANE Nuclear Policy Committee, Southern Christian Leadership Conference, Socialist Workers Party, War Resisters League, Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, Women Strike for Peace, and others.

The co-chairmen of the national steering committee are Sidney Peck, Cora Weiss, Stewart Meacham, Sidney Lens, Dave Dellinger, and Doug Dowd.

The local steering committee represents a wide spectrum of peace, religious, community and student organizations. The Rev. Dr. George Jordan is chairman, and Kenneth A. Kirkpatrick is executive director.

THERE IS MUCH TALK OF PEACE — BUT WHAT IS REALLY HAPPENING?

The Paris talks on the Vietnam war drag on month after month, while tens of thousands of men, women, and children continue to die in Vietnam. President Nixon talks about troop withdrawals, but, after the completion of the announced withdrawal of 25,000 U.S. troops, the total number of G.I.'s in Vietnam was still 3,500 more than when President Johnson left office.

ARE YOU OPPOSED TO THE WAR IN VIETNAM?

The majority of Americans are. According to a recent Gallup Poll, 58% of the American people think that we should never have sent troops to fight in Vietnam.

In spite of this, our men are still dying in Vietnam, and tens of billions of dollars are squandered each year on this useless slaughter. Meanwhile, the social fabric of this society disintegrates as tens of millions of deprived Americans lose hope and the gap between rich and poor widens.

WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT IT?

With your help we can build the momentum of the Vietnam Moratorium of October 15, which called for the WITHDRAWAL OF ALL TROOPS FROM VIETNAM NOW.

NOVEMBER CALENDAR OF EVENTS FOR THE NEW MOBILIZATION

San Francisco

Efforts are now under way to recruit in the State of Washington as many people as possible to participate in the San Francisco mass demonstration.

Peace March and Rally: November 15, 1969.

Demonstrators will assemble at 7:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. at Hamilton Square (Steiner and Geary). The Rally begins at 2 p.m. at Polo Fields (Golden Gate Park).

Washington D.C.

Plans are now being made to send as large a delegation as possible from Washington State to Washington D.C. to participate in the following activities:

March Against Death, A Vietnam Memorial: November 13, 14, and 15, 1969.

Beginning at midnight on November 13 the first of fifty state delegations, totaling 43,000-45,000 persons, representing the G.I.'s killed in Vietnam, will begin walking from Arlington National Cemetery in a solemn single-file procession past the White House to the steps of the Capitol. Each marcher will carry the name of a war victim and place that name in a coffin at the Capitol. After the march ends Saturday morning, November 15, the coffins bearing the names will be taken to the White House.

March on Washington November 15: TO BRING ALL THE TROOPS HOME NOW! Mass March to the White House followed by Rally at Ellipse.

Anti-War Lobby: for several days before and after the above-mentioned events scheduled for November 13, 14, and 15, 1969, in Washington D.C.

Seattle

Downtown Peace March and Rally noon November 14, 1969.
