KC Move the Money Resolution

Social Security and other services sustaining our community are under attack, and next to nothing is being done to create jobs. The Afghanistan war grinds on and the Pentagon budget keeps growing. Corporations and the 1%'ers are paying lower tax rates than the middle class.

Given this reality, we, the people call upon congress and the President to:

1. Create and protect jobs by investing in manufacturing, schools, housing, renewable energy, transportation and other public services;
2. Eliminate cuts to Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid, and Veterans benefits, and to housing, food and unemployment assistance;
3. Provide new revenues for these purposes and reduce the long-term federal deficit by closing corporate tax loopholes, ending offshore tax havens, and raising taxes on incomes over \$250,000 so that all pay their fair share; and
4. Redirect military spending to these domestic needs by reducing the military budget, ending the war in Afghanistan and reducing the number of U.S. military bases overseas.
